 <p>Knaith Hall look forward once again to welcome you to the annual Knaith Hall Snowdrop Walk. Enjoy the hint of spring in the air as you wander through the delightful snowdrop and aconite woods beside the mighty river Trent, in this park-like garden, with it's intriguing church. Step inside the church to discover some of its curious and fascinating history, with talks on throughout the event. For the more energetic there is also a longer walk on offer (45 mins return) to the unique Chateau at Gate Burton, which sits on a knoll like a dolls house with striking views across the Trent Valley. Tea/coffee and delicious home-made cakes will be available at the end of your walk, being served in the Hall beside a cosy log fire. (Stout shoes or boots are recommended, especially if doing the longer walk.)</p> <p>Dogs on leads are most welcome to attend the walk, and are also welcome in the church and the Hall, where home-made dog biscuits shall be available.</p> <p>Ample car parking is available in the grounds of the hall, free of charge.</p> <p>Knaith Hall is located on the A156 Lincoln/Gainsborough road, three miles south of Gainsborough, down the long drive at Knaith bottom.
