		<p>Common kestrel</p> <p>By September, rough grass can be heaving with small mammals, moving unseen through the thatch of golden stalks at ground level. Some years in Britain, field voles are thought to outnumber humans. This suits kestrels, whose fortunes are tied up with those of the chubby, short-tailed rodents. Voles mean kestrels, and where they are plentiful, the dashing falcons occupy smaller territories.</p> <p>Where to see Found on rough grassland such as farmland, heaths and wasteland. Good places to look are South Common, Viking Way near Bracebridge Heath and other similar areas.</p>
		<p>Canary-shouldered Thorn</p> <p>This moth named after the canary-yellow thorax or shoulders and is fairly common.</p> <p>Where to see It is found in woodland, gardens and a range of other habitats. They are often attracted to lights. https://butterfly-conservation.org/moths/canary-shouldered-thorn</p>
		<p>Goldfinch</p> <p>The Goldfinch is a seed-eating specialists with a bright red face. Its fine beak is perfectly adapted to extracting seeds from plants such as thistles and teasels. Most goldfinches spend the year in the UK, but some will leave for the winter, travelling as far south as Spain.</p> <p>Where to see They can occupy almost any habitat with scattered trees and bushes and can be found in open woodland, farmland, parks and gardens.</p>

		<p>Black-tailed Godwit</p> <p>These winter visitors come from the Arctic to winter on our muddy shores in their thousands forming big flocks.</p> <p>Where to see</p> <p>Winters mainly on coast, estuary mudflats and Saltmarsh. Good places to look are RSPB Frampton Marsh https://www.rspb.org.uk/reserves-and-events/reserves-a-z/frampton-marsh/ and Gibraltar Point National Nature Reserve https://www.lincstrust.org.uk/get-involved/top-reserves/gibraltar-point</p>
